OBJECTIVE

Create fun Badges for back-to-school, field trips, dramatic play or parties.

BACKGROUND

Create fun name Badges for multiple purposes from back-to-school orientation to field trips and dramatic play. As an icebreaker activity, allow students to print or handwrite their names and embellish as desired. Pair students and switch partners at timed intervals until all students have introduced themselves to others in the class. Students also share one way how they plan to be a good helper in the class. The Community Helper Badge activity helps the students realize how each person is an important member of the classroom community.

Badge or Safety Pins
Cardstock or Construction Paper
Chipboard
Colored Pens or Pencils
Glue Gun

INSTRUCTIONS

- The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.
- 1. Die-cut Badges from colored cardstock or construction paper. Die-cut and adhere chipboard for added durability.
- 2. Decorate each Badge with colored pens or pencils. Use a pen to write student names.
- 3. Attach a Badge pin or safety pin to the back of each Badge (see Main Photo).

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
