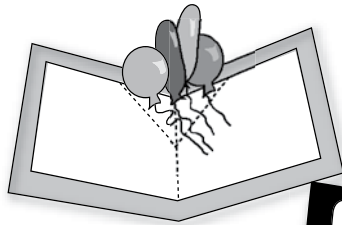

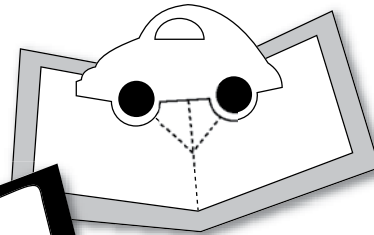
- Machine with 10" or wider opening

## 3-D Cards

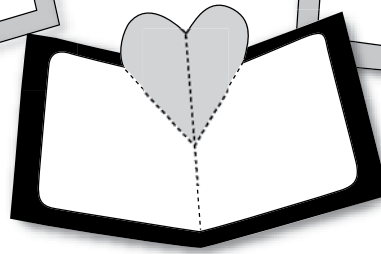
**3-D Card, Plain with Small Balloons #1 and A7 Card Cover**



**3-D Card, Plain with Large Car #2 and A7 Card Cover**

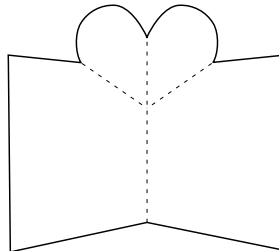


**3-D Card, Heart and A7 Card Cover**

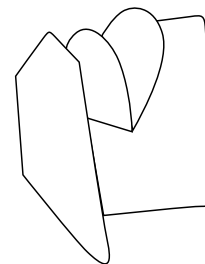


1. Die cut XL 3-D Card from cardstock or construction paper.
2. Fold on the perforated or crease lines so the pop-out section protrudes as shown (Figures A and B).

3. Add a Card Cover slightly larger than the 3-D Card. Glue Card Cover to the 3-D Card everywhere except on the pop-out section.
  4. Die-cut Ellison shapes or have students design their own shapes to glue onto the pop-out section if using the Plain 3-D Card.
- Use the Plain 3-D Card for reports. Adhere shapes that relate to the topic of the report on the cover. A Car die is excellent for a language arts report on "My Summer Vacation." Place lined paper in the message section for students to use when writing reports.
