## INSTRUCTIONS

## Kite, Tiger 3-D

Fold a 12" x 18" sheet of construction paper in half.
Place fold along midline of design and cut (Figure A).
Figure B is the finished cut shape.



- **4.** Tape a plastic drinking straw to the back of the Kite leaving a "funnel" for air to pass through. The straw will form a bridge (Figure D).
- 5. Cut plastic strips for the kite tail (crepe paper will also work). The strips should be about 2" wide. Tie strips together to make a tail that is about 5-8 feet long. Tape the tail to the back of the Kite (Figure E).




- If your Kite flutters, try making the tail longer.
- If your Kite won't rise, try shortening the tail.



- 2. Fold along all dotted lines and decorate front as tiger, panther, wild cat or any fantasy cat (Figure B).
- 3. Tape center of Kite together as shown (Figure C).



6. Attach string through holes in front, knotting the string in a loose loop to prevent the Kite from tearing (Figure F) and you're ready.
