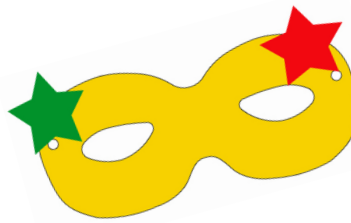


Superhero Mask



Concept: Create a cool looking hero mask for the little heros in your class.

Objective: Decorate incredibly fun masks to celebrate your favorite heros, or use them to celebrate a birthday or any festive occasion.

Supplies Used: Construction Paper, Glue, Ribbon, Scissors

Die Cuts used: ELA10683 (Mask), ELA10648 (Stars, 4-Up)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.
2. Die-cut the AllStar Mask using construction paper or poly foam.
3. Die-cut AllStar Stars 4-Up using various colors of construction paper or poly foam. Use other shapes to create different heros.
4. Adhere the die-cut shapes to the Mask using glue or Hold the Foam! Glue (see Main Photo).
5. Cut two 14" lengths of ribbon and attach to the holes in the Mask. Alternately, Elastic Mask Straps may also be used.

Create fun masks for every students in class. Discuss the importance of each individual in the classroom community and how everyone is special and ccan choose to be a hero. Allow students to decorate and personalize the masks for any occasion.
